Thank you very much for joining us today. Creative Art Mix is a self-produced project by hitaru aimed at not only creating and showcasing appealing, novel performing art that entertains the guests who come to see our shows but also supporting the artists and staff involved to improve their production skills and revitalizing the region. After spending two years in the creative studio, we are thrilled to be presenting our work in theater scale today as the third annual show in this series.

The past two performances held in the creative studio sold out quickly. The performances of the Creative Opera Mix series, the predecessor of Creative Art Mix, were also well-received, achieving an average guest satisfaction rate of 95%. Today's performance is the culmination of hitaru creation's activities over the past six years.

The previous performance, Creative Art Mix Vol. 2–Classical Jewels, was an omnibus live show presenting classical masterpieces reimagined in modern arrangements, allowing each piece to shine like a jewel. Today's performance builds upon the previous show, depicting changes in the times and society through unconventional arrangements, choreography from different dance genres, visual productions, and other techniques in five scenes from ancient times to the singularity predicted to occur in 2045: Hunting Society, Agricultural Society, Industrial Society, Information Society, and Singularity–New World.

In today's performance, the lead dancers will embody the existence that influences symbols of the mind/life and catastrophes and that changes through each historical period. What truth will remain following the rapid development of AI? We hope you will enjoy the show not only by appreciating the unique allure of each musical piece but also stepping back to view the performance as a whole by raising the level of abstraction.

We would also like to take this opportunity to express our heartfelt condolences for the loss of Ms. Yukiko Fuku, who left for heaven in February 2024. She was a cherished project member, contributing to past productions as a composer and arranger for Creative Opera Mix. In her memory, today's show will include *The Ride of the Valkyries* arranged by Ms. Fuku and TAMA.

Finally, we would like to express our deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported us and those involved in this project for their commitment. This achievement would not have been possible without their dedication and contributions.

We sincerely hope for your continued interest in this project as we remain dedicated to producing even better shows.

Changes in the times and society will be depicted through unconventional arrangements, choreography from different dance genres, visual productions and other artistic techniques in five scenes: Society 1.0 "Hunting Society," Society 2.0 "Agricultural Society," Society 3.0 "Industrial Society," Society 4.0 "Information Society," and Society 5.0 "Singularity -New World."

SOCIETY 1.0 Hunting Society	
Smetana: Moldau from the symphonic poems Ma Vlast (composed in 1874) Classical & hip-hop arrangement	
Smetana's piece depicting the past glory and sorrow of the Czech Kingdom has been arranged in hip-hop style while preserving the appeal of the original. It reflects both the blessings and the harshness of nature. • Arrangement: DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST • Choreography: Rui Nishino	<i>Ma Vlast</i> depicts Czech legends, nature, and history through six symphonic poems. The second and most famous poem, Moldau, celebrates the nature of the fatherland, describing how small springs grow into a great river.
Borodin: Polovtsian Dances from the opera Prince Igor (composed between 1869 and 1870) Classical & Jazz arrangement	
A classical arrangement of the renowned <i>Polovtsian</i> Dances, often performed independently, from the opera <i>Prince Igor</i> , will be showcased in combination with ballet. • Arrangement: Kengo Ono • Choreography: Midori Go	The opera <i>Prince Igor</i> is celebrated as a masterpiece represent- ing Russia, earning Alexander Borodin—who strived to create music unique to the country—a well-deserved reputation. The <i>Polovtsian Dances</i> , sung and danced in the opera, are often performed independently.

Delibes: Flower Duet from the opera Lakmé (composed i	n 1883) Pop arrangement
Hitomi Kuraoka will perform the <i>Flower Duet</i> , which is popular for its noble and beautiful melody originally performed by soprano and mezz-soprano duet, as a solo. • Arrangement: Kengo Ono	<i>Lakmé</i> , set in India, is an opera by French composer Léo Delibes, also famed for his ballet suite <i>Coppélia</i> . The <i>Flower Duet</i> features the harmony of two female singers.
Grieg: Morning Mood from Peer Gynt Suite No. 1 (a	mposed in 1875) Classical arrangement
Morning Mood from Peer Gynt Suite No. 1, originally composed for Henrik Ibsen's play Peer Gynt, will be showcased through a combination of contemporary and Butoh dance. • Arrangement: DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST • Choreography: Akinori Suzuki	<i>Peer Gynt</i> is the story of a young wanderer traveling in search of fortune and adventure. This music, composed by Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg for the play written by compatriot Henrik Ibsen, captures the lyrical and pure essence of Northern Europe.
Beethoven: 4th movement (Ode to Joy) from Symphony No. 9 in D minor "Choral" (composed in 1824) R&B/soul arrangement	
Hitomi Kuraoka will perform this iconic Beethoven piece, fondly nicknamed <i>Daiku</i> (meaning number 9) in Japan where it is traditionally played across the country as a year-end seasonal event, in a R&B/soul arrangement. • Arrangement: Kengo Ono • Choreography: Akinori Suzuki	<i>Daiku</i> , Beethoven's final symphony, is a fusion of orchestra and vocals, showcasing the artistic mastery of the composer, often hailed as a musical revolutionary. The theme of the 4th movement sung by soloists and chorus is known as <i>Ode to Joy</i> .

Suppé: Overture to the operetta Light Cavalry (comp	osed in 1866) Jazz arrangement
The dawn of the Industrial Revolution will be portrayed through a jazz arrangement of the overture to the operetta <i>Light Cavalry</i> , one of Suppé's outstanding works. • Arrangement: Kengo Ono	While Austrian composer Suppé's Light Cavalry is rarely performed, it is renowned for its overture with striking trumpet fanfare.
Bizet: L'amour est un oiseau rebelle (Habanera) from the opera Carmen (composed between 1873 and 1874) R&B/soul arrangement	
 Hitomi Kuraoka will sing the iconic aria L'amour est un <i>oiseau</i> rebelle from <i>Carmen</i>, one of the most popular operas. Arrangement: Kengo Ono Choreography: Minami Tsubota 	The opera <i>Carmen</i> tells the story of a tangled romantic relation- ship between a Spanish corporal and a Romani woman. <i>L'amour</i> <i>est un oiseau rebelle</i> , a song sung by the title role about her capricious love, is also known as Habanera (meaning a Havanan dance).
Ravel: <i>Boléro</i> (composed in 1928)	Techno arrangement
Boléro, the ballet music composed by Maurice Ravel with a simple and captivating repeating rhythm, will be reimagined in a techno arrangement and performed alongside contemporary dance. • Arrangement: DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST • Choreography: Akinori Suzuki	<i>Boléro</i> is widely known as an orchestral piece; however, it was originally composed as ballet music, commissioned by the female dancer, Ida Rubinstein. The piece features two recurring themes, building a magnificent crescendo that evolves from a solo to the full orchestra.

SOCIETY 4.0 Information Society

Rachmaninoff: Vocalise (composed in 1915)

Vocalise, one of the most beloved pieces among Rachmaninoff's works, will be performed by a band, featuring beautiful vocals accompanied by piano.

Arrangement: Kengo Ono

Chopin: Revolutionary Etude (composed in 1831)

An electrical music arrangement has been applied to the fast and vibrant melody of *Revolutionary Etude*, blending seamlessly with the accompanying dance to create dynamic energy.

A medley of classical masterpieces, including Bach's organ piece Toccata and Fugue in D minor and Beethoven's Symphony No. 5 in C minor Fate, will be played by a band in unorthodox arrangements.

Vocalise is a wordless song sung using only a single vowel. This piece by Rachmaninoff, who was active during the final years of the Russian Empire, is especially popular for its beautiful melancholic melody.

Electronic arrangement

R&B/soul arrangement

Chopin composed this piano piece in response to anger toward the Russian Empire when the people of his homeland, Poland, armed themselves and revolted against the empire. It was dedicated to his friend, Franz Liszt.

Medley (Toccata and Fugue in D minor by Bach, Symphony No. 5 Fate by Beethoven, others) Rock, club jazz, and other arrangements

Toccata and Fugue in D minor (composed around 1708) is especially popular among Bach's organ pieces. The piece contrasts the toccata, with its free and improvisational nature, and the fugue, with strict counterpoint.

Symphony 5 (composed between 1807 and 1808) is an iconic symphonic piece. Often referred to as Fate, the symphony earned its nickname from a remark attributed to Beethoven about its theme: "This is the sound of Fate knocking at the door."

SOCIETY 5.0 Singularity-New World

Richard Strauss: symphonic poem Also sprach Zarathustra (composed between 1895 and 1896) **Electronic arrangement**

Also sprach Zarathustra, inspired by the works of Nietzsche and used as the theme song for a popular film, will be performed in a spectacular electronic arrangement on the theme: a sign of a significant change.

Strauss composed this symphonic poem with great creative freedom inspired by the works of German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche. Its dramatic opening is famous as the iconic music featured in the film 2001: A Space Odyssey.

The music drama Die Walküre is the second of four epic operas

comprising Der Ring des Nibelungen, which is based on Norse

Wagner: Ride of the Valkyries from the music drama Die Walküre (composed between 1854 and 1856) Club arrangement

Ride of the Valkyries, well-received in the Creative Opera Mix series, will be performed in a Creative Art Mix version combined with dynamic dance. DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST arranged this piece based on the arrangement by Yukiko Fuku, who was the bandmaster and arranger for the previous Creative Opera Mix series.

Healing arrangement

Holst's popular pieces from the suite The Planets-Mars, with its tense melody, and Jupiter, known for its arrangement by a renowned Japanese pop singer—will be presented through a collaborative performance by Butoh, contemporary, and ballet dancers.

English composer Gustav Holst's The Planets is an orchestral suite featuring seven planets. Inspired by astrology, each piece carries a subtitle rooted in Roman mythology, such as Mars, the Bringer of War, and Jupiter, the Bringer of Jollity.

Leoncavallo: Vesti la giubba from the opera Pagliacci (composed in 1892)

Hitomi Kuraoka will perform a heavy metal arrangement of the aria of love and hate from Pagliacci, a masterpiece of the verismo opera, sung by tenor singers.

Heavy metal & electronic arrangement

The opera Pagliacci tells the story of Canio, the leader of a group of traveling actors, who becomes consumed by jealousy and rage upon discovering his wife's infidelity. Canio's aria, Vesti la giubba, conveys his sorrow of performing as a clown by controlling his feelings of jealousy and rage.

Puccini: Nessun Dorma from the opera Turandot (composed between 1921 and 1924)

Hitomi Kuraoka will sing the well-known aria Nessun Dorma from Puccini's unfinished masterpiece, Turandot, set in ancient China.

Turandot, set in Beijing of ancient China, tells the story of Prince Calaf trying to solve riddles to win the love of the beautiful yet cold Princess Turandot. This aria, sang by Prince Calaf as he expresses his unwavering belief in love, is a representative piece for tenor singers.

Dvořák: 4th movement from Symphony No. 9 in E minor, From the New World (composed in 1893) **Rock arrangement**

The 4th movement of From the New World, composed by Dvořák with thoughts of his homeland, the Czech Republic, during his stay in the United States, will be performed in a heavy metal arrangement.

This is a masterpiece of Czech composer Antonín Dvořák composed during his stay in the United States, which was a "new world" at the time. In Japan, the piece is beloved alongside Beethoven's Fate Symphony and Schubert's Unfinished Symphony as one of the three great symphonies.

Kengo Ono (Composition/arrangement/saxophone/wind synthesizer)



Ono broadened his music horizons, focusing mainly on jazz, as a member of the Hokkaido University Jazz Society. He tours nationwide with his band, performs at major events, collaborates with renowned artists, and supports their concerts. In 2015, Ono performed at the Rising Sun Rock Festival as a member of Koki Ito with SPYCE. He is also involved in jingle music production, direction, performance, and arrangement for Sapporo City Jazz, one of the largest jazz festivals in Japan. In addition, he is dedicated to nurturing young musicians through workshops and other educational initiatives as an instructor.

DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST (Arrangement/DJ)



Based in Sapporo, DJ TAMA a.k.a. SPC FINEST, Chair of DJ School Sapporo, is a master among professionals in bringing people of all races and music lovers together through his craft as a DJ. Active globally, he has successfully conducted annual international tours since 2009, focusing primarily on Asia, including those to Thailand, the United States, South Korea, Vietnam, Myanmar, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and China. He ignites audiences with his performances at sporting events, including B League Levanga Hokkaido home games, the Ski Jumping World Cup, REDBULL 400, and CP 3×3 wheelchair basketball games.

Hitomi Kuraoka (Soprano)



After graduating from the Showa University of Music, Kuraoka went to Italy as a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship recipient. She developed her skills at the training institute of Teatro Regio di Parma and made her debut at the opera house. Her numerous appearances include the Festival Verdi and productions hosted by the Arturo Toscanini Philharmonic Orchestra, Milan Cathedral, and other domestic and international theaters and concert halls. Upon returning to Japan in 2018, she earned an excellent reputation for her leading role in the opera *Nonno – the Beats from the Jomon Period*, hosted by the Sapporo Education and Culture Hall, the Countess in *The Marriage of Figaro*, hosted by the Sapporo Cultural Arts Theater "hitaru," and her performance with the Sapporo Symphony Orchestra at the 37th Hokkaido Bank Lilac Concert. She is a member of the Associazione italo-giapponese dell'Hokkaido and a crew member of the Fujiwara Opera.

Midori Go (Classical ballet)



Go joined Sapporo Buyoukai in 1999, where she studied classical ballet under Masako Chida. She has performed major roles in all of Sapporo Buyoukai's productions, including works choreographed by Masako Chida and Tokihiko Sakamoto. She further honed her skills through her short study abroad visits to the Ecole Superieure de Danse de Cannes Rosella Hightower in France and to New York. Her dedication led to notable achievements, including winning The Balletcom Sapporo in 2012 and receiving the Art Award (Stage Division – European Dance Section) from the Association for Sapporo Cultural Organizations in 2022. In 2023, Go performed the Arabian dance in *The Nutcracker* (all acts; stage direction and choreography by Masako Chida), which was the first hitaru ballet project, earning tremendous acclaim for her performance.

Rui Nishino (Street dance)



Nishino is an instructor at Fe. dance studio. She began taking classical ballet classes at Sapporo Buyoukai at the age of four. At the same time, she explored hip hop, jazz, and all the other dance genres at her own studio, performing on numerous stages from a young age. In 2018, she was selected as one of the first awardees of the Hokkaido Mirai Challenge Fund Culture and Art Category, which provided her the opportunity to study abroad. She serves as a Cultural and Art Hokkaido ambassador, contributing to initiatives such as productions organized by the Association for Sapporo Cultural Organizations and the Hokkaido Dance Project to promote and advance dance culture and art. As a Hokkaido member of Chibi Unity, a three-time consecutive world champion dance group, Nishino mentors teenagers dreaming of becoming world-class dancers. She remains active across a wide range of dance scenes.



Akinori Suzuki (Contemporary dance)



Suzuki, Chair of DANCE STUDIO LoRe, began his dance journey at the age of 10. After exploring different genres, he developed a unique dance style inspired by the nature of Hokkaido. His distinguished career includes performances as a death angel in 225 shows of the Toho musical *Elisabeth* national tour and as an R&J dancer in *Romeo and Juliet* shows hosted by Tokyo Broadcasting System Television and HoriPro in Tokyo and Osaka. Suzuki is also active internationally; he was invited to showcase his works and conduct workshops at international festivals in Korea (Seoul and Goyang), Hong Kong, and Marseille. His accolades include the 59th Sapporo Cultural Organizations Festival Art Award and the FY2024 Cultural Encouragement Award of the Association for Sapporo Cultural Organizations.

Tsukasa Kamidate (Butoh dance)



In 2014, Kamidate begun studying under Butoh dancer Hal Tanaka. She made her solo debut with *Mi-Machigai* in 2016 and embarked on a tour visiting four European countries (Germany, the UK, Poland, and Austria) in the following year, 2017. In 2018, she was invited to perform the solo piece *Batokyo* at the Hokkaido Butoh Festival. In 2019, she participated in the Taiwan International Darkness Dance Festival (Taiwan), Butoh New Generation – Inheritance and Innovation (Kyoto), and other events. Since 2014, she has been a leading member of the Butoh Dance Company *Kyokuhoku-kai*, performing in numerous Butoh productions.

Minami Tsubota (Jazz dance)



Tsubota began her dance journey in 2000 at Dance Studio mind and has performed in productions by the studio and the Hokkaido Dance Project (HDP). She led the Hokkaido Students Dance Association *spark*, where she organized events, participated in competitions, and contributed to stage design, direction, and performance in the association's production *Dream*. Tsubota performed in *The Most Powerful* Mobile Amusement Park in History Dreams Come True Wonderland Kurodori!? in 2015 and Creative Art Mix Vol. I2 – Classical Jewels in 2024.

Ken Kikuchi (Classical ballet)



Kikuchi joined Asami Maki Ballet Tokyo in 2000. After making his debut as a principal dancer in *The Nutcracker* in 2002, he performed leading roles in numerous productions. From 2020, he served as the principal dancer and assistant ballet master in the company, providing performance instruction. Kikuchi left the company in 2024 and is now working as a freelancer. His distinguished career includes invitations from Roland Petit to perform in *Le Jeune Homme et La Mort* and *Pink Floyd Ballet* at the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées in France and the Bolshoi Theatre in Russia. He also appeared as a guest dancer in *La Traviata* for the 10th anniversary of the New National Theatre, Tokyo. In *INFINITY*, artistically directed by Tamiyo Kusakari, he shared the stage with Shoko Nakamura, Koharu Sugawara and Tomohiko Tsujimoto. Kikuchi won the 37th Rookie of the Year Award from the Dance Critics Society of Japan and the 37th Nimura Dance Award.
